DR. G. HERZBERG, F.R.S.C., F.R.S., director of the Division of Physics, has been awarded the Henry Marshall Tory Medal of the Royal Society of Canada for his achievements in the field of atomic and molecular spectra.

Dr. Gerhard Herzberg was born in Hamburg (Germany) on December 25, 1904, and obtained his primary and secondary school training there. Subsequently he studied physics at the Darmstadt Institute of Technology and obtained his Dr. Ing. degree in 1928. From 1928 to 1930 he carried out post-doctorate work at the Universities of Goettingen and Bristol where he held a research studentship. In 1935 he joined the staff of the University of Saskatchewan as Research Professor of Physics, a position that he held until 1945, when he accepted a position as Professor of Spectroscopy at the Yerkes Observatory of the University of Chicago. He returned to Canada in 1948 in order to accept a position as Principal Research Officer with the National Research Council at Ottawa. On January 1, 1949, he was appointed Director of the Division of Physics of the National Research Council. In 1951 he was elected to the Fellowship of the Royal Society of London in recognition of his outstanding achievements.
