Following up our conversation of yesterday, I called Professor Goldberg. It appears that he would be quite interested in the possibility of having a two-month temporary appointment with NRC at a time to be decided later. He has an arrangement with Queen's University somewhat different from the one he had during the past year. The appointment he will have for next year is that of an adjunct professor which involves travel from the University of Illinois, where he has his permanent position, to Queen's University at frequent intervals. He thinks that the time will come in the development of this whole scheme when his presence in Ottawa would be very important and therefore he does greatly appreciate the possibility of the temporary two-month appointment. He asked me whether it would be possible for you to confirm to him in a letter the possibility of such an arrangement. During the strike mail to Queen's University could, of course, be sent through the Inter-University Transit System.

I am enclosing a copy of the proposal for the Institute of Advanced Studies which Goldberg sent me. It is rather long and I don't expect you to read it all, but by glancing at it you might find some explanation of what this matter is all about.
